


DESERT GRANDEUR

LUSTERING by hundreds on sightly ground overlooking a vast and fascinating desert valley stand the palms of the unique Oasis of Biskra. 

Jungle-like clusters of Washingtonia palms reproduce perfectly the settings of Algerian Oases.




VOGUE of THE DESERT




Portion of the "Street of Souks", or native shops to be constructed in the Walled Oasis of Biskra.








